





EUCHARISTIC EXPOSITION AND BENEDICTION

EXPOSITION

The Order for Solemn Exposition of the Holy Eucharist provides several settings for the Liturgy of the Hours and two Eucharistic Services of Prayer and Praise. This liturgy in its various forms is designed to "acknowledge Christ's man ous presence in the sacrament and invites us to the spiritual union with Him acculminates in sacramental communion." (Order for Solemn Exposition of Holy charist).

As the Priest, Deacon or other minister prepares the Holy Lagrist adoration, O Salutaris Hostia (page 774) or other suitable chant is sung.

In the Sacred Triduum, the Church solemnly celebrates the greatest mysteries of our redemption, keeping by means of special celebrations the memorial of her Lord, crucified, buried, and risen.

The Paschal Fast should also be kept sacred. It is to be celebrated everywhere on the Friday of the Lord's Passion and, where appropriate, prolong also through Holy Saturday as a way of coming, with spirit uplifted, to the soft the Lord's Resurrection.

For on this same night I will go through Egypt, striking down every firstborn of the land, both man and beast, and executing judgment on all the gods of Egypt—I, the LORD! But the blood will mark the houses where you are. Seeing the blood, I will pass over you; thus, when I strike the land of Egypt, no destructive flow will come upon you.
